





- Confirm the strategic role of freight transportation through the consolidation of existing infrastructure



- Determine land use in accordance with specific restrictions









- Build new road links, especially in the Cavendish Boulevard corridor
- Improve the image of the main thoroughfares and ensure the safety of pedestrians and cyclists

- Improve access to the area






