2400	M. KEDAR SANCHEZ-SMITH : Hello, my name is Kedar. We are Innovation Youth Connections program, located in the district of Peter-McGill. This program brings together individuals so they can succeed in getting a high school diploma, build life skills and social skills. Connections provides space for young people to come, do their academic work. A space that fosters motivation and inspiration. At Connections,
2405	we develop academic, professional and personal skills, gain job experience, and develop independence.
2410	As we imagine what could become of the former Royal Victoria Hospital, we want to focus on three areas: Highlighting its history, accentuating its natural beauty, and developing services for those in our city in greatest need.
	Mme CHRISTA SMITH-KINGSTON :
2415	So first, we believe a history museum should inhabit the space, to tell the story of medicine through the ages. Who were the nurses and doctors? What tools were used? How were patients cured, what means were used to cure illness? How did medicine evolve at the Royal Vic? It's very important to tell and retell the story of the hospital and how it addressed the issues it encountered decade to decade. This could serve as an educational tool for school groups and guided tours. Short videos, time capsules and the like would make for a vibrant and educational
2420	museum.
2425	Second, the site sits next to the Mount Royal, as we know, and provides beautiful views of both the city and of nature. And so, we believe the natural beauty of the site and of the mountain needs to be at the forefront of plans. Let's create community gardens where neighbours, together, can cultivate fruits and vegetables. Let's create walking gardens, kind of in the style of the
	botanical gardens, with benches for rest and respite. And, let's remarry the site to the mountain.

2430	M. KEDAR SANCHEZ-SMITH :
2435	Finally, our city is filled with people who are faced with tremendous challenges every day. We believe the Royal Vic can address some of those needs. There is space for homeless shelters and housing, care for veterans and for the elderly. Free daycare and food banks would be a great service to the vulnerable. French classes and cultural studies for newly arrived immigrants would be a beautiful use of this space.
2440	We at Connections benefit greatly from a place at Innovation Youth that takes the good people of heart. Every day, we have access to the space that helps us flourish in life. Royal Vic could be the same for the city of Montreal, and for the people of Peter-McGill. Thank you.

2445	So, it is to us to thank you, for taking the time and having the interest in this huge project. First thing, I Did you have a chance to visit the site, to walk around the buildings a little bit?

2485	The fact that the Royal Vic was built as a very, you know, high-tech, latest theory, and so on, and so on, type of hospital There's one example in Montreal, the Money Museum, the Bank of Montreal, on place d'Armes, which, similar concept, I think, to what you're talking about. Takes us through how money evolves throughout time, about two centuries. Did you have any idea of where, in the whole complex, you would like this museum to be located? Have you thought about that at all? Is that something you've considered?

Another student in Connections, he talked about the style of Pointe-à-Callière, and how that uses different mediums in a museum, so kind of that, like the video idea, or time capsules. 2630	And so, they come, they be a student for a day to see if it's a good fit, and then they enroll in our program, and so then the Connections students, like Kedar, are with us from Monday to Thursday, 10 to 3. It's through the EMSB, and DEAL, which is Distance Education and Adult Learning.
2635	And so, they're working through their high school credits, and then we bring in tutors, and then they get job experience. Like Kedar works at the food bank, and then can get job experience through customer service. He works reception, he's been with me in the kitchen. And then, they also They establish their own personal, professional and academic goals. And then, we come alongside them to help them flourish in those goals.
