Subject: Motion to Pedestrianize Wellington Street

Hello Council and Neighbours of Verdun,

My name is Pauline, and I live in 2E avenue Verdun. I have been living in my apartment for 3 years, and each year, I get to **fall in love** with the Verdun community and the Wellington Street all over again – especially every summer.

In 2019, I moved from Calgary to Montreal for a new job opportunity and for a change of scenery. Montreal (at least, the island) is mainly **walkable** and I am happy to rely on the public transport to get around. No more headaches of traffic, parking, snow removal, maintenance, repair, and insurance costs.

In those initial years, I enjoyed many green spaces such as Parc Jarry and Jeanne Mance Park, as well as the pedestrianized streets of Saint Catherine. These same streets allow seasonal vendors to sell their hand-made goods and allow the hosting of events like salsa classes and dancing where you get together...and dance with a stranger! Old and young alike, friends and family. It was on one summer evening on July 2024 where I spontaneously decided to join in the fray and danced with 7 new friends I made! We remain good friends to this day. This was an accomplishment – do you know how hard it is to make new friends in a new neighbourhood, in a new city, as an adult? I am equally heart warmed looking at families taking evening strolls together, and elderly on scooters moving around with no obstacles and with safety and confidence.

I love Verdun, and I love Wellington Street. It is not surprising that Time Out Magazine named it the **coolest street** in the world (August 2022). It is because of the vibrant community and welcoming businesses that gather at the same space. It is important for people to **take up space**.

The pedestrianization is a staple of **European city walkability**. It strengthens **community bonds**, promotes **social interactions**, and allows for **accessibility** and safety from vehicles and traffic.
