1. I strongly support this initiative to improve the quality of life and environment in the Centre-West downtown area.

- 2. I am a long-time resident of the area and use the many facilities that are orientated on Atwater Avenue.
- The Atwater Library and Computer Computer Centre (ALCC) is one of the most important cultural and educational resources in this area and should be included in the plan with appropriate funding.
- 4. The ALCC provides many services to the adults and seniors who live in the Centre-West and other areas of the City of Montreal. It sits on the border of Montreal and Westmount but has always been a Montreal institution from its founding in 1828 and will always serve as such.

- 8. The ALCC occupies its own building, that has heritage status, with the entrance facing Cabot Square. The Montreal Children's Library has a separate entrance on Tupper Street.
- 9. Support for the ALCC will fit all the priorities of the "Plan d'action pour révitaliser l'ouest du Centre-Ville de Montréal" and will add value to the entire project.
- 10. I encourage the planning committee to include the Atwater Library and Computer Centre in the plan and to provide generous funding of this invaluable community institution.
